May I Deadlines!!!

Enrollment Status and Adding/Dropping Projects

The project add/drop deadline for new and returning 4-H'ers is May 1. 4-H members must be enrolled in the project by May 1 and have an Active status in 4HOnline to be eligible to exhibit in the corresponding project area at the Johnson County Fair. Project enrollment is an important component of the project experience. 4-H families can update this information any time in 4HOnline by simply editing the 4-H member's profile. This option will be available until midnight on May 1 and then after that the system will not allow any changes to be made to a 4-H member's projects. If you have questions please contact your club leader or the Johnson County 4-H office.

Horse Identification and Horseless Horse Certificates

All Horse Identification Certificates and Horseless Horse Certificates are due to the Extension office by 5 p.m. on May 1. Appropriate forms can be found at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/events-programs/livestock.html.

4-H Horse Snaffle Bit Projects

Horse snaffle bit projects are due to the Extension office by 5 p.m. May 1. Along with the nomination, the 4-H member must submit the Horse Identification Certificate and a \$10 fee. Three-year-old snaffle bit projects must have been nominated the previous year and do not have to have been shown to re-nominate.

4-H members planning on showing their animals at the Kansas Junior Livestock Show and/or the Kansas State Fair need to have nominations to the Youth Livestock office by May 1. Information pertaining to the Kansas Livestock Nominations can be found at www.YouthLivestock.KSU.edu.

County Fair Entries

4-H entries for exhibits judged during the county fair will be due July 26. All entries for home environment, fiber arts, clothing construction, fashion revue, and dog show will be due on **July 1**. Late entries will not be accepted and if a 4-H'er does not meet the deadline they will not be allowed to have their item or project judged in the 4-H division.

All sheep, swine, beef and goat exhibitors will be required to submit stall requests and tag numbers by July 26. If your family has weighed and tagged their animals under a family nomination, you will be required to enter the tag number(s) with the 4-H member's name who is exhibiting the animal by the July 26 deadline. Livestock exhibitors: you must enter in showmanship if you plan on exhibiting in showmanship. All livestock entries must be accompanied at check-in with a printed entry tag. In the event a 4-H'er forgets to bring their entry tag, the Fair office will be available to print it.

Only online entries are accepted. The entry system will open June 1 and can be accessed through the Johnson County Fair website at www.jocokansasfair.com. Note: Once an entry is submitted it cannot be edited. If assistance is needed in making online entries please contact the Extension office or the Fair office. It is highly recommended that you print off your entry confirmation.

After the entry deadline adding a class/entry is not an option. If you are not sure about what you are taking to the fair, please wait until closer to the deadline to make your entries. This will help keep dropped entries to a minimum as the Fair Board has to pay for each dropped entry.

In order to save time with project check-in at the fair, 4-H'ers are strongly encouraged to print their entry tags at home.

Mr. and Miss 4-H

The Johnson County Mr. and Miss 4-H Program recognizes young people for the leadership and commitment they have contributed to the 4-H program and their communities. All 4-H'ers who have been a member for at least three years and are at least 13 (as of January 1, 2017) are eligible to apply. More details about the application and interview process, including dates, will be coming soon.

Food and Clothing Labels

Food labels (including those for Food Preservation) are available to pick up at the Extension office as well as on the Johnson County 4-H website at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/events-programs/johnson-county-fair.html to print off at home. Clothing labels can be made by typing, or printing in ink, on a 3" x 5" piece of white cloth: Class Number, Name, and Address. Please refer to your department's rules in the fair book regarding labels.

Photo Mats

The Extension office has photo mats available for Photography project members to purchase. Each mat is \$1.25. Photos exhibited in the 4-H Photography division at the county fair will require a photo mat. You may pick up photo mounting directions and labels at the Extension office. Entering Quilts in the Fair

If you are entering a quilt in the Johnson County Fair the ideal department to enter it in is the Fiber Arts department. The judge for Fiber Arts will be more experienced with quilts and therefore better able to give 4-H'ers helpful feedback.

4-H Foods Judging

The 4-H foods judging will take place at Gardner Elementary School from 2-8 p.m. on Monday, July 31.

A note from our FACS/Health and Food Safety agent regarding food entries:

The 4-H Fair is just a few months away! Many of you may already be researching and testing recipes for your food entries. To make sure your entry is food safe and eligible for judging, please keep the following in mind:

- Your product should <u>not</u> require refrigeration.
- Cream cheese in any form (even baked in the recipe) is **not** allowed.
- Fresh fruit is **not** allowed.
- Egg custards and recipes using egg custards are **not** allowed (including cakes and pies).
- Fruit and pecan pies are ok so long as all ingredients have been baked. So, no fresh fruit sitting on top, please.

If you have any questions about your food entry, please contact the Extension office.

Canning and Preservation fair classes: 4-H'ers should only use CLEAR canning jars for the fair. Save the colored blue and green canning jars for home use. Colored jars may have to be opened to check canned ingredients and if it is opened it cannot go on for further judging. This a food safety issue.

Project Check-in

Projects will be checked in on Monday, July 31, from 6:30-9 p.m. and again on Tuesday from 8-10 a.m. Projects not checked in by 10 a.m. on Tuesday will not be eligible to be exhibited. Please plan on arriving before 10 a.m. to have ample time to check in all of your projects. Livestock exhibitors, please refer to the fair book for your check-in time.

Cloverbuds Show and Share

Enrolled Cloverbuds are invited to participate in Show and Share on Tuesday, August 1 from 10 a.m.-1 p.m. in the 4-H building. This is a reminder that Cloverbuds are not eligible to compete in the 4-H division at the fair. Full membership starts when youth turn 7 before January 1 of the current 4-H year. Cloverbuds can bring a maximum of two projects to show and share. Each Cloverbud will sign up for a 15 minute time slot. A signup sheet will be available Monday evening and Tuesday morning during project check-in inside the 4-H building. Projects that are reasonable in size and are not living/breathing will be displayed in the 4-H building and available for pick up Sunday, August 6.

Livestock T-shirts

The Johnson County Fair Association requires all livestock exhibitors to wear Johnson County Fair t-shirts when exhibiting livestock at the fair. The fair association is changing colors of the shirts this year, requiring the purchase of new show shirts for the 2017 year. This year's shirt will be yellow in color. The cost is \$7 per shirt. Please place your order with your club leader by your club's deadline. ****Club leaders, please see the Leader section on page 14 for details on how to place your club's order.

Livestock and Project Auctions

Livestock Auction: Exhibitors must turn in auction forms to sell their livestock to the Fair Office by 12 p.m. Friday, or 30 minutes after the conclusion of the beef show, along with a W-9 IRS form.

Project Auction: Project auction forms must be turned in by 12 p.m. on Wednesday along with a W-9 IRS form, no exceptions.

It is against policy of the Johnson County Fair for any livestock or projects sold at the 4-H/FFA auction to be shown at any other county, state or national competition. See the 4-H/FFA Livestock Auction or the 4-H/FFA Project Auction section in the 4-H Fair Book for more details about the Livestock Auction or Project Auction.

State Fair Entries

All 4-H exhibits that receive a purple ribbon are eligible to enter at the Kansas State Fair as long as there is a comparable department at the State Fair. 4-H'ers who qualify to exhibit at the State Fair may sign up in the Fair Office from 3-5 p.m. Thursday, August 3 and Friday, August 4. 4-H members must be 9 before January 1, 2017 to enter in the State Fair. All entries for the Kansas State Fair must be made with the Extension office by 5 p.m. Thursday, August 10. **Please note:** beef, sheep, swine and meat goat entries for the Kansas State Fair are due by July 15 and Horse Show entries are due by August 1.

Project Pick Up

All 4-H livestock and horses can be removed from the fairgrounds after 6 a.m. Sunday, August 6. All remaining exhibits will be released at 9 a.m. 4-H'ers must pick up their entries or make arrangements with another 4-H'er to pick up their entries by Sunday morning at 9:30 a.m. If a 4-H'er does not pick up their entries it is the responsibility of the Club Leader to collect the rest of the club's entries. All 4-H entries and premium money will be available for pick up after the fairgrounds have been cleaned. It is expected that 4-H exhibitors help with fair clean-up.

Local Opportunities

Wild Clover 4-H Camp

This will be the second year for Wild Clover 4-H Camp. It is an overnight camp available for youth ages 7-9 years old (before January 1, 2017) and will be held June 2-3, 2017 at Wildwood Outdoor Education Center in La Cygne, Ks. Wild Clover 4-H Camp is a two-day, overnight adventure for youth wanting to get a mini camp experience. There will be swimming, fishing, creating arts and crafts, hiking, and singing around a campfire. The cost is \$85 per camper and transportation is not provided. Summer Cooking Day Camp

Cooking Day Camp this summer will be June 13-15. Cooking Camp is open to youth ages 7-12 and is held at the Extension office from 9 a.m.-noon. Registration is \$50 per youth and the registration link is posted on the Johnson County 4-H website at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/events-programs/camps.html.

Join Comet Tech 4-H Club for a Demonstration on Newton's Laws of Motion

The Comet Tech Junior leaders combined 5 projects this last year and to teach their younger club members and community about Sir Isaac Newton and his three laws of motion. The projects include Woodworking, Technology, Leadership, Community Service; and Communications. At each project meeting they would learn, experiment and test Newton's three laws of motion in various experiments and discuss the forces that come against motion. They each built three boats of wood with which the laws of motion are applied and tested. Each boat has a different propulsion system; one with a paddle displaying kinetic energy; one with an

inflated balloon which takes stored energy, funnels it through a tube and brings about motion of the boat with air. The third boat employs a candle and copper coil over it. When the copper coil is filled with water, the lit candle turns that water to steam, creating a suction and flow of water through the coil to bring about motion. The junior leaders made a gutter "waterway" to demonstrate how stored energy in the boats turned to kinetic energy and studied the motion and how Newton's laws apply to the boats. Each junior leader chose one of the three laws to present to the younger members



of Comet Tech to teach and demonstrate how motion works and what forces come against the boat's movement in water. After the presentation, the younger members will be allowed to play with the boats, ask questions and put Newton's laws to the test for themselves. The Junior Leaders will also present the same demonstration at Wonderscope Science Museum on May 6, at 10 a.m. If you would like to join this Comet Tech 4-H club for this demonstration and to hear a special speaker talk about Fanuc robots (technology) being used in the work place, please join us on Tuesday, May 16, at 6:30 p.m. at the Johnson County Extension Office.

Local Opportunities

City Market's Youth Market

This summer the City Market is implementing a Youth Market in conjunction with the Wednesday Farmers' Market from June through August, 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.. The Youth Market is geared towards kids ages 5 to 18 and has a separate application process from the weekly Farmers' Market. There is no application fee or deadline, but participants must turn in applications at least two (2) weeks before they would like to begin at the market. Farm, garden, or site inspections are required prior to participants' first day at the market. Participants can attend as many or as few of the Wednesday markets as they like. Spaces designated for youth vendors are \$5/day for 8' wide and 19' deep, allowing for a parked vehicle at the booth if desired. Participants must have an adult 18 or older at the booth with them.

Has Your Family Completed Enrollment for 2017?

4HOnline opened October 1 for families to re-enroll current 4-H members for the 2017 4-H year and for new families to enroll. We asked that all current 4-H members be re-enrolled by November 1, 2016. If you have not re-enrolled yet please do so immediately. Your family is missing out on important correspondences from the Extension office as only the contact information from 2017 enrollments in 4HOnline is being used.

The Kansas 4-H office has made a step by step brochure for re-enrolling which we have posted on our website at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/forms-resources/. We have also posted the Kansas 4-H brochure for enrolling for new families. Please read the brochure to assist your family in re-enrolling, and here are a few tips to point out:

- **Log in to your family's existing profile. <u>DO NOT</u> create a new family account!
- **Most data will pre-populate from the 2016 year's data, but make sure you double check and edit items that may have changed from last year. Items like: Volunteer Status (Yes or No), Volunteer Type (i.e. Project Leader, Secretary, etc.), Club Name, Project changes, etc.
- **The Participation Form is filled out as part of the enrollment process, therefore no hard copy form needs to be turned in to the office.
- **If you are a Club Leader or Project Leader you will not be able to log in to your club/project until you have re-enrolled and your enrollment has been accepted by our office and the Organizational Report for your club has been turned in to the Extension office.

Livestock Grant and Mentor Applications

The Johnson County Livestock Association will again this year provide funding for their 4-H Livestock Grant and Mentor Program. The Grant Program will award \$1,100 to a 4-H'er enrolled in the beef project and \$300 to a 4-H'er in each of the sheep, swine, and goat projects. Experienced 4-H'ers who apply to the Mentor Program could earn \$500 for the beef project and \$300 in each of the sheep, swine, and goat projects. If you would like an opportunity to apply for the Grant Program or Mentor Program, please fill out an application by the July 14 due date. 2017 Centennial Delegates – National 4-H Congress

The Kansas 4-H Centennial Delegates were added in 2002 when National 4-H celebrated 4-H's centennial year. Kansas 4-H has permitted each Extension Unit to send one at-large delegate to National 4-H Congress. These at-large positions are called Centennial Delegates. Cost for the Centennial delegate will be the full amount of approximately \$1,150 (no registration grant is offered). To be eligible, delegates MUST:

- * Have never before attended National 4-H Congress.
- * Be enrolled in Kansas 4-H.
- * Have a genuine desire to attend National 4-H Congress.
- * Be available to attend 2017 National 4-H Congress in its entirety from November 24-28, 2017.
- * Be at least 14 years old but not yet 19 years old before January 1, 2017.
- * Remain committed to attending 2017 National 4-H Congress once they accept the trip.
- * Agree to follow the prescribed code of conduct, realizing failure to do so may result in the loss of privileges during the event and/or in the future.

If you meet these qualifications and this opportunity sounds exciting to you, please let Christin know of your interest by May 8, 2017. One name will be randomly drawn and the winner will need to provide a non-refundable \$100 deposit for the trip by May 11, 2017.

Campference Scholarship Opportunity!



Leader Update

2017 Enrollment

4HOnline opened October 1 for families to re-enroll current 4-H members for the 2017 4-H year and for new families to enroll. We asked that all current 4-H members re-enroll by November 1, 2016. Double check with families in your club to make sure that they have re-enrolled. If they have not please ask them to re-enroll **immediately**. Families are missing out on important correspondences from the Extension office if they are not re-enrolled, as only the contact information from 2017 enrollments in 4HOnline will be used going forward.

The state 4-H office has made a step by step brochure for re-enrolling which we have posted on our website at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/forms-resources/. We have also posted the state's brochure for enrolling for new families. Please read the brochure to assist your family in reenrolling, and here are a few tips to point out:

- Log in to your family's existing profile. DO NOT create a new family account!
- Most data will pre-populate from the 2016 year's data, but make sure you double check and edit items that may have changed from last year. Items like: Volunteer Status (Yes or No), Volunteer Type (i.e. Project Leader, Secretary, etc.), Club Name, Project changes, etc.
- The Participation Form is filled out as part of the enrollment process, therefore no hard copy form needs to be turned in to the office.
- If you are a Club Leader or Project Leader you will not be able to log in to your club/project until you have reenrolled and your enrollment has been accepted by our office and the Organizational Report for your club has been turned into the Extension office.

As always, if you have any questions about the 4HOnline system do not hesitate to contact your 4-H staff.
