State Fair Entry Drop-off

Those projects that were registered for entry into the Kansas State Fair can be dropped off at the Extension office Tuesday, September 4, through Thursday, September 6, from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. There will also be drop-off time before the Council meeting on Tuesday evening until 6:45 p.m. Fresh food and flower entries can be brought in at the same time as all other entries, however (to help with freshness) we will accept them from 8-9 a.m. on Friday, September 7. Please note that this drop-off time is only available for food or flower entries, as the van will already be loaded with all other entries. IMPORTANT: Please read the rules in the State Fair 4-H Handbook as well as check the Exhibit Area Downloads links for any class you entered in. A link to the handbook and the additional downloads links are posted at www.kansas4-h.org/p.aspx? tabid=46. To find the Exhibit Area Downloads link for your class: 1) Scroll down the page to find your Department. 2) Review all necessary forms and information for your entry. 3) We have all entry tags at the Extension office, but if there are other documents required you will need to print them off and bring them in with your exhibit. We know this is a lot of information, please call the office if you have any questions.

Remember to Write Your Thank You Notes!

A thank you note should be sent if you received a trophy, belt buckle, special award, and/or sold a project in one of the auctions. Don't forget to send a thank you note to your department chairs as well. This year's County Fair could not have been such a success without all the amazing donors and volunteers. Please take this opportunity to let these gracious donors of awards and their time know how much we appreciate all that they do.

Eight Local 4-H'ers on Kansas Shooting Sports Team

Kansas took a team of 36 shooters to Grand Island, Nebraska June 26-29 to compete at the National 4-H Shooting Sports Championship. Teams of four shooters per discipline competed against other states all week in multiple events. The Kansas team took third place overall, with many teams and individuals placing as well.

The 4-H'ers from Johnson County were:

- -Kenton S. (Livestock Club) and Liza R. (Morning Glory) in Air Rifle.
- -Austin W. (Prairie Moon) in Compound Archery.
- -Jennifer C. (Frontier Family) in Recurve Archery.
- -Ben R. (Morning Glory) in Muzzleloading.
- -Chase E. (Morning Glory) in Small Bore Pistol.
- -Justine W. (Pioneer) and Kyleigh H. (Pioneer) in Small Bore Rifle.

The overall team placings at Nationals for those disciplines were: Air Rifle-1st place, Compound Archery-21st place, Recurve Archery-5th place, Muzzleloading-3rd place, Smallbore Pistol-1st place, and Smallbore Rifle-6th place.

Three Johnson County 4-H'ers were also recognized as top individuals overall. For Air Rifle, Liza received 1st and Kenton received 6th. For Muzzleloading, Ben received 1st. Amazing job, 4-H'ers!

NEW! Shooting Sports Air Pistol 4-H SPIN Club

The Johnson County 4-H Shooting Sports project will hold an introductory Air Pistol SPIN Club. Join us to learn the basics of air pistol shooting in a fun, safe environment. This indoor class will focus on providing an introduction to the sport of target air pistol shooting with an emphasis on gun safety and handling. Pistols, targets, pellets and other equipment will be provided, however participants are asked to bring their own safety glasses. The class is taught by Kansas certified 4-H Shooting Sports instructors. Participants do not have to be a 4-H member but must be between 12 and 18 years of age (before January 1, 2019).

This class is a pre-requisite for joining the air pistol competition squad and for participating in smallbore pistol next summer. Those who show an affinity and wish to compete further, may be invited to join the air pistol competition squad for the regular season which will run from December to April.

The Air Pistol 4-H SPIN Club will meet on Thursday evenings, 6:30-8 p.m. from October 4 through October 25. The class location is indoors on the Johnson County Fairgrounds in Gardner, KS. A \$40 equipment fee will be required. Registration will open September 4, 2018. The link for enrollment will be found at www.johnson.k-state.edu/classes-events/. Non-4-H members will be required to turn in a SPIN Enrollment Form and a Kansas 4-H Participation Form. Interested in 4-H Shooting Sports? Don't miss this required introduction!

If you are new to 4-H Shooting Sports, we want you in the next Fall Introduction to 4-H BB-Gun Special Interest (SPIN) club. Start planning now! Introduction to 4-H BB-Gun SPIN is a required prerequisite to shoot in some of the other 4-H shooting disciplines in Johnson County 4-H, including competitive 5-meter BB gun, 10-meter air rifle, 50-meter smallbore rifle, and muzzle -loader. If you want to shoot in any of those disciplines, you must enroll in the Introduction to 4-H BB-Gun SPIN club. Simply enrolling in the 4-H Shooting Sports project does not guarantee the opportunity to shoot. The SPIN club ensures new shooters have a safe and manageable introduction to the sport. It also puts youth who are interested in competitive shooting on a solid track toward long-term success in the more advanced disciplines. BB SPIN gives you:

- A fun opportunity to shoot BB guns in a safe environment monitored by state-trained and certified 4-H adult volunteers.
- An intensive 6-session educational introduction to the exciting sport of 5-meter competitive BB shooting.
- Comprehensive gun-safety and gun-handling education.
- Introductory training in the prone, standing, sitting and kneeling positions.
- Test knowledge of NRA and Daisy BB Gun curriculums.

Don't have a BB gun? No problem. The club has a sufficient supply of guns. You <u>do not have to own one</u> in order to participate.

BB SPIN is open to anyone who will be at least 9 years old as of December 31, 2018. Meetings will be every Tuesday at 6:30 p.m. from September 25 through October 30 at the Johnson County Fairgrounds in Gardner.

After the BB SPIN 6-week course is complete, participants who show interest and affinity may be invited to join the competitive squad for the regular 4-H BB-Gun season, which lasts from November until the state 4-H championship in early April.

IMPORTANT: SPIN enrollment for fall 2018 will be capped and the course will fill up quickly. So if you want to shoot, <u>do not delay in enrolling</u>. Registration will only be accepted online.

Countywide Astronomy Project Activities

Are you interested in space? Have you ever looked up at the night sky and wondered who, what, and where we are in the universe? If so, welcome to the Johnson County 4-H Astronomy Project! We have a number of fun and educational activities planned this year:

- 1. Trip to the Powell Observatory Educational presentation entitled "Life in the Universe" along with a tour of the night sky and viewing through telescopes, including the Ruisinger Telescope, the largest telescope open to the public in a five-state area (askc.org/observatories/powell-observatory)

 Date: Saturday, September 29, 2018 Time: Presentation begins at 7 p.m. The presentation lasts about 20 minutes and then telescopes are available to view the moon, planets, stars, nebula, etc. Telescopes are available well into the night, so interested participants can stay as late as they would like. Location: Powell Observatory, 26500 Melrose Street, Louisburg, KS 66053

 Requested Donation: 12 & over=\$8, 5-11=\$5, Under 5=Free **Because the observatory is staffed by volunteers, a donation is requested upon entry to help maintain and operate the observatory**

 Etiquette: No white lights (headlights, flashlights, mobile phones, etc.) are allowed at the observatory. Red flashlights are allowed. Please dim your headlights when approaching and leaving the observatory.
- 2. Heart of America Star Party The Heart of America Star Party is the Astronomical Society of Kansas City's largest annual event, hosted at their 40-acre Dark Sky Site, 75 miles south of Kansas City, near Butler, MO. There will be guest speakers, geocaching and other activities for kids, and lots of telescopes available for star gazing. Meals are included for those that register before September 15. Late registrants and walk-ins are welcomed but they cannot guarantee meals or merchandise availability. Dates: October 4-7, 2018 Registration: You can register for a single day, or 2 or more days at askc.org/index.php/events/hoasp. A group of 4-H'ers could meet on either that Friday or Saturday depending on the weather. Please e-mail handerson3@gmail.com if you are interested in coordinating a trip. Location: The Dark Sky Site is near Butler, MO. Once you register, you should receive a map to the campgrounds.
- **3. Spring 2019** the dates aren't set yet, however we plan on having a series of activities in the Spring, including:
- *Another trip to the Powell Observatory. (A date will be chosen once the schedule for Spring 2019 programs are released.)
- *Interested members will meet to learn about the physics of telescopes and learn to make one to enter at the Fair.

State Opportunities

Kansas 4-H Youth Leadership Council Application Process

Youth Council members work to involve youth with K-State Research and Extension in promoting, developing, implementing and evaluating Kansas 4-H Youth Development programs in order to reflect the needs and interests of the youth in the state. Council members will also plan and conduct the Kansas Youth Leadership Forum (KYLF), Citizenship in Action, Campference, 48 Hours of 4-H, and other events. Any Kansas 4-H member between the ages of 14 and 18 before January 1, 2019 may apply. This year's KYLF delegation will elect representatives from the four extension program areas (NE, NW, SE, SW).

Links to the Youth Council application and information are posted on the KYLF webpage at https://www.kansas4-h.org/get-involved/volunteer-opportunities/youth-leadership-council/.

Applications are due online October 1, 2018 before 5 p.m. CST and two letters of reference must be postmarked or uploaded on the registration site before October 1, 2018 at 5 p.m. The signature page should be postmarked by October 1, 2018. This year the elections will include the application process detailed above, and from those applications up to 12 young people per area will be invited to interview with a panel on Zoom. From those that interview, up to six candidates will be selected to be in the election.

National 4-H Conference

The National 4-H Conference is a working conference in which youth and adults, at the invitation of the Secretary of Agriculture, assist in the development of recommendations to help guide 4-H Youth Development programs nationally and in their communities. This event brings together youth, volunteer leaders, and state and county Extension staff members from across the United States, the U.S. Territories, and the Canadian Providences.

2019 4-H Youth in Action Awards

Every 4-H'er has a story, and those stories are worth telling! Sharing your 4-H story could earn you a scholarship and trip to Washington, D.C. for National 4-H Council's Legacy Awards! The 4-H Youth in Action Program will recognize four confident youth leaders (ages 16-19) in agriculture, citizenship, healthy living and STEM. Winners receive a \$5,000 higher education scholarship, promotional video showing your impact story, all-expenses paid trip to Washington, D.C. for National 4-H Council's Legacy Awards, and more. International 4-H Exchange Opportunities

Opportunities for 4-H members begin at age 12 (for Japan and Korea exchanges) and age 15 for exchanges to Costa Rica and Finland in 2019 through States' 4-H International Exchange Programs. 4-H alumni 19-25 are eligible for exchanges to a number of countries through the IFYE program. Volunteers, staff and alumni over 25 may apply to chaperone all of the States' 4-H Exchanges. There are career enhancement opportunities for IFYE's in addition to the leadership and life skills development that all exchanges offer. New scholarship opportunities are offered this year as well.
