Attention all Knitters

Knitting Camp is for 4-Hers enrolled in the knitting project. If you are not in the knitting project and would like to participate in Knitting Camp, contact Pat at pat.geier@jocogov.org and let her know you would like to enroll in the project. Knitting Camp is also a great opportunity for a parent, grandparent or adult mentor to join in on the fun.

Knitting Camp will be held from 10 a.m. to noon on January 30, plus each 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month through and including July 10, 2010. The volunteer instructor for Knitting Camp is Pat Mummert, an avid knitter with 76 years of knitting experience. 4-H Knitting Leader Cindy Quaintance, an accomplished knitter with ten years of knitting experience, will assist Pat the 2nd Saturday of every month. FACS Agent Valeria Edwards, a hobby knitter for 40 years, will assist Pat the 4th Saturday of every month.

In this series of Saturday morning Knitting Camps, 4-Hers will have the opportunity to learn and refine basic knitting skills of casting on and binding off, as well as the basic knit and purl stitches, by completing practice projects. We will also have opportunities to learn about yarn, knitting equipment, reading a knitting pattern, and other skills that develop an accomplished knitter.

Food Fare

The 2010 4-H Food Fare is scheduled for January 30 at the Extension office from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. This year's theme is desserts and sweets. Admission is free. However, everyone is encouraged to bring a nonperishable food item for Gator Aid. Lunch will be available for an additional fee.

4-Hers may bring one or two perishable desserts to be judged. Some examples of perishable desserts are cream pies, puddings, flans, cheesecakes, cakes with cream cheese frosting and fancy candies. These desserts should not be the same as what you bring to fair.

4-H'ers will be able to come and go at a hands-on station in the morning while desserts are being judged. You can try your hands at fondant modeling, pie crusts, smoothies, chocolate molds, etc. Stations will be come and go to accommodate the food judging schedule.

The afternoon sessions will cover cakes, cookies, candy making and table setting for dessert parties. 4-Hers may choose the sessions according to their skill level.

Kansas high school youth are invited to apply for participation in a dynamic program designed to educate youth about the livestock industry through an engaging summer experience hosted by K-State Animal Sciences and Industry. The goal of this academy will be to further develop young leaders within the livestock industry and prepare them for a successful future in this field.

The four-day event, June 9-12, will focus on increasing knowledge of Kansas' diverse livestock industry, as well as building participant's leadership skills. Twenty high school students will be selected to participate based upon educational, community, and agricultural involvement, as reflected through an application process.

The academy will welcome students to the Department of Animal Sciences at K-State and provide on-campus housing. Students will receive interactive leadership training at Weber Hall and tour K-State Animal Science Facilities. The second portion of the program will allow students the opportunity to tour businesses and organizations within Kansas' livestock industry.
