Kansas City 4-H Global Summit

The 2013 Kansas City 4-H Global Summit (KCGS) will be held March 14-17 at the Hilton Airport Hotel, Kansas City, MO. Registration fees for youth are \$310 and \$420 for adults. Participants should also bring \$75 to \$100 for lunch and dinner Friday, lunch Saturday, breakfast Sunday and personal expenses such as shopping, gifts or snacks. Crafts will be available for purchase at the Ethnic Enrichment Festival on Saturday evening.

This is open to youth who are 15 years of age and not yet 19 years of age before January 1, 2013. Prior 4-H membership is not required. Registration is now open by visiting www.kansas4-H.org and clicking on Home and then "register". January 10 is the last day to register. Payment and a completed Kansas 4-H Participation form is due to the Extension office by 5 p.m. on January 10. Checks are payable to Johnson County 4-H Council Fund.

The **2013 Kansas 4-H Scholarship** form -fillable application can be found at http://www.kansas4h.org/DesktopDefault.aspx under Resources, then Awards or under "What's Hot". 4-H members wanting to apply must have completed applications to the Extension office by 5 p.m. on Monday, January 28.

Scholarship selection is based on 4-H merit: 40 percent on 4-H leadership; 30 percent on 4-H citizenship/community service in 4-H; 20 percent on 4-H participation and recognition; and 10 percent on non-4-H participation, leadership, community service, participation, and recognition in school and community. A complete list of scholarships will be in the January **Kansas 4-H Journal**. Graduating seniors and college students are encouraged to apply.

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K-State Animal Science Leadership Academy

The fifth annual K-State Animal Sciences Leadership Academy will be held June 5-8, 2013 at Kansas State University's Manhattan campus. The goal of the academy is to further develop young leaders within the livestock industry through an engaging summer experience hosted by K-State Animal Sciences and Industry. This four-day event will focus on increasing knowledge of Kansas's diverse livestock industry, as well as building participants' leadership skills. Twenty high school students will be selected to participate based upon educational, community, and agricultural involvement. The event is sponsored by the Livestock and Meat Industry Council. Kansas Citizenship Washington Focus

Adding/Dropping Projects

The project add/drop deadline for new and returning 4-H'ers will be May I. 4-H'ers who have not established project enrollment by May I will not be eligible to exhibit in the corresponding project area at the Johnson County Fair. Project enrollment is an important component of the project experience. A report of project enrollment will be published on March I for families to confirm project enrollment. 4 -H'ers will have until May I to finalize their project enrollment. Kansas Junior Swine Producers Day

Kansas Junior Swine Producer Day is scheduled to be held Saturday, February 16, 2013 at Kansas State University's Weber Arena. K-State faculty, grad students, and speakers will provide hands-on education over topics such as selecting your youth project, nutrition, general swine care, and showmanship. Youth and parents will be encouraged to participate in a non-competitive swine skillathon. Youth will also have the opportunity to participate in the Youth Pork Quality Assurance Plus certification session. Volunteer Information Profile

Johnson County 4-H depends on volunteers to help give our youth the best 4-H experience possible. The Volunteer Information Profile is to insure our volunteers have the best interest of young people at heart. Some people may not even be aware they are required to fill out a VIP. A volunteer is an adult or teen with authority to independently plan and conduct educational experiences for youth with other adults present or in a public setting OR a volunteer whose position puts him or her in close, ongoing, one-to-one interaction with youth must complete the VIP process. Volunteer roles include, but are not limited to, judging team coach, community leader, organizational leader, project leader, camp counselor, camp assistant, Discovery Days or other event chaperone, exchange trip chaperone, chauffeur for any 4-H activities, and 4-H activities, and county-wide project leader. New volunteers must complete and submit the VIP Application at the beginning of their first year. Once the initial application is filled out volunteers fill out a shorter form called the VIP Renewal Form. This renewal form needs to be filled out on an annual basis. The fall is a great time to renew your VIP application.
