Adding/Dropping Projects

The project add/drop deadline for new and returning 4-H'ers will be May I. 4-H'ers who have not established project enrollment by May I will not be eligible to exhibit in the corresponding project area at the Johnson County Fair. Project enrollment is an important component of the project experience. A report of project enrollment will be published on March I for families to confirm project enrollment. 4-H'ers will have until May I to finalize their project enrollment. Any 4-H'er wishing to add or drop a project will be asked to submit a project add/drop form. The form can be found at www.johnson.ksu.edu/4Hforms.

VIP Renewal

A reminder, for Kansas 4-H Volunteers to retain their registered VIP status they must complete and turn in an Annual Renewal form to the local county/district Extension office. This is a simple one page form that asks their contact information, what the leadership role(s) they will be doing, any changes in their legal involvement and to recommit to the Kansas Volunteer Code of Ethics. The renewal form gives the local office vital information for good management of the local 4-H program and as such is an invaluable management tool.

Deadline for Host Exchange

Families who would like to host a teen from Argentina, Cameroon, or Norway for one month should submit applications by February 15. These applications are submitted to States' 4-H International Exchange Programs Office in Seattle, so they have to have all details completed and sent to arrive there by March I. Applications for 12-16 year -olds from Japan can be submitted now or until Kansas fills our allotment for Kansas placements. Young adults 19-25 are expected from Wales, Germany, Taiwan, Austria, Switzerland and possibly some other countries under the IFYE program. They need families for 2-3 week periods between mid June and State Fair.

ROBOTIC CAMP

This Spring Break Camp promotes 21st Century careers in Science, Engineering and Technology through GPS, GIS and robotics. GEAR-Tech-21 teaches robotics, GPS (global positioning systems), and GIS (geographic information systems) technologies through building and programming a robot, navigation, and mapmaking activities. Camp participants will have experiential and empowering learning adventures programming robots to complete challenge courses, learning how to operate GPS units to find hidden waypoints, recording data in GPS units and importing it into GIS to create custom and utilizable satellite maps, and so much more! The evenings will be filled with friends and fun camp activities such as a low ropes teambuilding and leadership adventure course, cabin crew cook-offs, campfires, and more!

The registration fee will cover all meals, snacks, lodging, and activities, and campers will be led by cabin crew counselors and taught by curriculum certified instructors. By the end of the intensive camp, participants will have a much greater understanding of geospatial and robotics technologies, potential careers, ways to stay involved in these projects, and come away with new friends and excitement! K-STATE ANIMAL SCIENCES LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

Kansas State University will host the fifth annual K-State Animal Sciences Leadership Academy June 5-8 for young livestock industry leaders in Kansas. The program, hosted by the Department of Animal Sciences and Industry, focuses on increasing participants' knowledge of the Kansas livestock industry, as well as enhancing leadership skills.

Twenty high school students will be selected to participate, based on educational, community, and agricultural involvement. Students will stay in campus housing and receive training in Weber Hall as well as tour the university's animal science facilities and Kansas livestock businesses. Students must apply by Friday, March 15. Candidates have to be enrolled in high school as of January I and able to participate in the entire academy.

The academy is sponsored by the Livestock and Meat Industry Council.
