Eight 4-Hers received funds each year to help support their livestock projects. Grant winners received from \$250 to \$1000 for their beef, sheep, swine or goat projects. 4-H Shoot Sports Nationals in Grand Island, NE

Two local competitors recently returned from 4-H Shooting Sports Nationals in Grand Island, NE. Teams of up to 4 members each from Kansas were picked from top placing individuals at Kansas 4-H State matches. Members and teams representing 9 disciplines competed against each other as individuals, and as part of the state team. Awards were presented for each day, overall discipline winners, and overall team sweep-stakes. 32 states sent competitors.

Bryce Zimmerman took an individual daily award, and earned a 5th place ribbon out of 67 competitors in the Small bore Rifle competition. The Kansas Small bore Rifle team placed 3rd out of 17 states. Barry Zimmerman was team coach.

Ethan Eccles took individual daily awards, and earned a 1st place medal out of 33 competitors in the Hunting Skills competition. The Kansas Hunting Skills team placed 3rd.

These two individuals helped earn Kansas a 3rd place overall in the sweepstakes, behind Texas and Missouri.

State Horticulture Judging Contest



Johnson County 4-H Shooting Sports Members Compete at National Invitational

Congratulations to the members of the Johnson County 4-H Shooting Sports Rifle Team, who competed at the 48th Annual Daisy Nationals BB Gun Championship Match, June 27-30, in Rogers, Ark. The team represented Johnson County 4-H among the field of 54 youth teams from across the nation in the oldest and most prestigious 5-meter BB gun championship in the nation. They earned their spot in the field by qualifying at a regional tournament earlier in the year. This is the second year the Johnson County 4-H team has been invited to the event. Highlights of the Daisy match included:

- Team alternate Chase Zimmerman placed fourth in the nation for shooting in the prone position after a three-way tie for second place was broken on the basis of one point on a single target.
- Last year's team member Ethan Wheeler, participating in a special event hosted for the previous year's team members, received a gold medal for overall score and a bronze in both the standing and kneeling positions.
- Also participating in the special invitational for last year's champions, Kyleigh Haun received a gold medal in the kneeling position and a bronze medal for overall score.

Livestock Exhibitors

The tagging and spring weight data for sheep, swine, beef and goats will be posted within the next couple weeks. Make sure you are viewing the 2013 data before filling out your entry form. This is the same information that should be used when making entries for the county fair. 4-H'ers should double check the list for accuracy. 2013 Johnson County 4-H Fair Book

The electronic version of the 2013 Johnson County Fair Book is available to view at http://jocokansasfair.com/Fair%20Book.htm. The Johnson County Fair Board has graciously decided to provide each 4-H family with a hard copy of the fair book free of charge. Fair books will be distributed through club leaders this summer.

County Fair Entries

4-H online entries for exhibits judged at the county fair will be due July 31. All paper entries will be due on July 15. All entries for home environment, fiber arts and clothing construction, fashion revue and dog show will also be due on July 15. Late entries will not be accepted. If a 4-H'er does not meet the July 31 deadline for online entries they will not be allowed to have their item or project judged in the 4-H division unless approved by the Fair Board.

All livestock exhibitors will be required to submit a stall request by July 15. All sheep, swine, beef and goat exhibitors will be required to submit tag numbers by the July 31 deadline. If your family has weighed and tagged their animals under a family nomination, you will be required to enter the tag number(s) with the 4-H'ers name who is exhibiting the animal by July 31. Livestock exhibitors: you must enter in showmanship if you plan on exhibiting in showmanship.

Online entries will be available on June I at http://jocokansasfair.com/OnlineEntries.html. It is highly recommended that you print off your entry confirmation. On step 5 you should find an option to print a detailed receipt. If on step 5 you have the box checked to send an email confirmation you will also receive a detailed receipt in an email.

After July 31, adding a class/entry is not an option. Please enter the classes you believe you will actually be bringing to exhibit at the fair. The Fair Association pays a fee for all entries including no shows. Most 4-H classes close a week before the fair so you should have a good idea of what you are going to bring before then. Open class entries close just before judging so there is no need to enter any exhibits you are not sure about, just enter them online before you bring them to the fair.

In order to save time with project check-in at the fair, 4-H'ers with non-animal projects are encouraged to print their entry tag(s) at home.

Project Check In

Projects will be checked in on Monday, August 5, from 6:30 - 9 p.m. and again on Tuesday from 8 -10 a.m. Projects not checked in by 10 a.m. on Tuesday will not be eligible to be exhibited. Please plan on arriving before 10 a.m. to have ample time to check in all of your projects. 4-H foods judging will take place at Gardner Elementary School from 2 - 8 p.m. on Monday, August 5. Livestock exhibitors, please refer to the fair book for your check in time.

Project Pick Up

All 4-H livestock and horses can be removed from the fairgrounds after 6 a.m. Sunday, August 11. All remaining exhibits will be released at 9 a.m. <u>4-H'ers must pick up their entries or make arrangements with another 4-H'er to pick up your projects by Sunday morning at 9:30 a.m</u>. All 4-H entries and premium money will be available for pick up after the fairgrounds have been cleaned. It is expected that 4-H exhibitors help with fair clean up.

4-H Food Stand

Each year the Johnson County 4-H Council has a Food Stand at the county fair. This is our ONLY fundraiser for the County Council. County Council funds Achievement Celebration, transportation for 4-H Camp, Discovery Days, trip scholarships for 4-H'ers, Family Night and Officers Training, County and Regional Club Days and much more. A two hour shift at the food stand is a small price to pay for a year of all the great county-wide activities. The food stand schedule, along with the food stand info sheet is posted at www.johnson.ksu.edu/4HForms. All 4-H families working the food stand should review the info sheet prior to the county fair to ensure a successful and fun food stand shift! The info sheet will be posted by June I. On Monday evening (Aug. 5) each club will need to send two adult volunteers to your club's assigned time. Those volunteers will need to also work during your club's assigned shift later in the week. This will help with efficiency and organization of the food stand.

Heritage Plaza Bricks

Heritage Plaza Bricks at the Johnson County Fair Grounds are still available. Cost is \$100.00 engraved. Our Goal would be to have all Johnson County 4-H Clubs represented and all those who have ever been involved with 4-H and/or the fair. It is a great way to say thank you to an individual or leader who has made an impact on you during your 4-H career and/or your life. State Fair Entries

All 4-H exhibits that receive purple ribbons are eligible to enter their exhibits at the Kansas State Fair. 4-H'ers who qualify to exhibit at the state fair may sign up in the fair office from 3 - 5 p.m. Wednesday, August 7 through Friday, August 9. 4 -H members must be 9 as of January 1, 2013 to enter. All entries for the Kansas State fair must be made by 5 p.m. Tuesday, August 13. Please note all livestock entries for the Kansas State Fair are due by July 15.

Clothing and Food Labels

Foods and Food Preservation Labels are available to pick up at the Extension office. Please refer to your department's rules in the fair book regarding labels. 4-H mall no longer makes clothing labels therefore we do not have clothing labels available in the office. To make your own clothing labels: type or print in ink on a 3" x 5" piece of white cloth the class number, name of exhibitor and address. Sew labels in back of neck or center back of waistband. Other items – secure in an obvious place.

Photo Mats

The Johnson County Extension office has photo mats available for photography project members to purchase. Each mat is \$1.15 and checks are to be made payable to the Johnson County Extension. Photos exhibited in the 4-H photography division at the county fair will require a photo mat. The Extension office also has photo mounting directions available.

Public Presentations at the County Fair

All 4-H'ers planning on presenting a public presentation at the fair will be required to enter by the July 31 entry deadline. 4-H'ers will sign up for their presentation time in the fair office. The sign-up sheet will be in the fair office from Monday 5 pm to Wednesday 5 pm. This will be the schedule that is followed for presentations on Thursday, August 8. The Club Day guidelines will be followed for all categories. Club Day guidelines can be found at www.johnson.ksu.edu/4HClubDay.

Fair Clean Up Schedule
