# State Fair Entry Drop-off

Those projects that were registered for entry into the Kansas State Fair can be dropped off at the Extension office now through Thursday, September 4, from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Keep in mind that we have limited room in the van, so if you have any large items you may need to transport them yourself. Feel free to call the office if you have questions about size. Fresh food and flower entries can be brought in at the same time as all other entries, however (to help with freshness) we will accept them from 8-9 a.m. on Friday, September 5. Please note that this drop-off time is only available for food or flower entries, as the van will already be loaded with all other entries.

# 2014-2015 Enrollment

Enrollment for the 2014-2015 4-H year will be done completely online by 4-H families. National 4-H has decided to use a new online data management system going forward. Online enrollment will open November 1, 2014. More information about the new system and how to enroll will be coming soon. This year a hard copy Participation Form is still needed on file at the Extension office by December 1, 2014.

# Don't Miss Your Chance to Shoot!

### Important changes have been made to Shooting Sports eligibility requirements.

Johnson County's 4-H Shooting Sports program has really taken off. Important eligibility changes have been made to maintain the quality of the program and ensure a safe experience for participating youth. If you are new to 4-H Shooting Sports simply enrolling in 4-H Shooting Sports as a project *does not guarantee the opportunity to shoot with the club*.

 $\cdot$  If you are new to 4-H BB gun, you must enroll in the program through the SPIN (Special Interest) Club track. SPIN Club ensures inexperienced shooters have a safe and manageable introduction to the sport and puts potential competitive participants on a solid track toward longterm success in the more advanced disciplines. Therefore, *BB gun SPIN Club is effectively a prerequisite* for future participation in the more advanced firearm disciplines.

• BB gun SPIN Club enrollment for fall 2014 will open on September 15, at the following link and will only be accepted online: <u>https://events.jocogov.org/exc/dev\_students.asp?</u> <u>action=coursedetail&id=2992</u>.

 $\cdot$  BB gun SPIN Club enrollment for fall 2014 will be \$35 per participant and is capped at 30 participants. *It will fill up quickly*, so if you want to shoot, do not delay in enrolling.

# 4-H Shooting Sports Nationals

Two Johnson County 4-H Shooting Sports competitors made a second year trip to 4-H Shooting Sports Nationals in Grand Island, NE this past summer. Individuals may only participate in a single discipline once at Nationals during their 4-H career. Teams of up to 4 members each from Kansas were picked from top placing individuals at Kansas 4-H State matches. Members and teams representing 9 disciplines competed against each other as individuals and as part of the state team. Awards were presented for each day, overall discipline winners, and overall team sweepstakes. States from all over the country participated in events during 1 day of practice and 3 days of competition.

Ethan Eccles took an individual daily award and earned a 10th place ribbon overall out of 52 competitors in the Recurve Archery competition. The Kansas Recurve Archery team placed 6th, just out of a team award, out of 17 states. Arn Eccles was the team's coach.

Bryce Zimmerman took 3 individual daily awards and earned a 4th place ribbon out of 70 competitors in the Air Rifle competition. The Kansas Air Rifle team placed 1st out of 19 states. These two individuals helped earn Kansas a 3rd place overall in the sweepstakes, behind Texas and Missouri.

# Citizenship Washington Focus 2015



# **National 4-H Conference**

The National 4-H Conference will be April 11-16, 2015 in Washington D.C. and is a working conference in which youth and adults, at the invitation of the Secretary of Agriculture, assist in the development of recommendations to help guide 4-H Youth Development programs nationally and in their communities. This event brings together youth, volunteer leaders, and state and county Extension Staff members from across the United States, the U.S. Territories, and the Canadian Providences. Delegates must be 15-18 years old by January 1 of the year of the conference. One adult chaperone will also be selected to accompany the delegation. Chaperones must be at least 21 years old and must be VIP registered. Interested adult volunteers should complete the same application as the youth. Applications and letters of reference are due in the State 4-H Office no later than 5 p.m. October 1. Interviews for all programs will be conducted on December 6 in Manhattan, KS. States' 4-H International Exchange Programs are only for youth aged 12 – 18: -Costa Rica, travel dates are June 18 to July 17, 2015 -Finland, travel dates are June 29 to August 1, 2015 (approximate) -Japan, 8-weeks, travel dates are June 10 to August 6, 2015 -Japan, 4-weeks, travel dates are July 8 to August 6, 2015 Exchanges include a home stay with a host family for most of the month. IFYE Association of the USA, Inc. exchanges are only for 4-H alumni, aged 19-25. 4-Halumni 19 to 25 may apply for individualized programs of 6 weeks to 6 months in partner countries in Europe, Asia, Africa and Latin America. # Leader Update

### 2014-2015 4-H Enrollment

There was a decision made from National 4-H which was to stop the support of 4-H ACCESS database by 2015. This link explains National's reasoning behind discontinuing the database: <u>http://</u> <u>tinyurl.com/ACCESS-fact-sheet</u>. The State 4-H office notified us in late July of this decision. The biggest positive is we will be using a new system which 19 of the biggest states currently are using and have been for several years called *4HOnline*. This new system will be used for the upcoming 2014-2015 enrollment process.

With 4HOnline, 4-H families will enroll themselves online. We are currently working on tweaking a brochure for our county and will provide each club with them to give to your families. This brochure is quite helpful on the "how-to" of 4HOnline.

We will no longer accept hard copy enrollment forms. We recognize this will be a big change for our 4-H families. While many families have been asking for online enrollment, others prefer the hard copy enrollment forms. Families will have the ability to print a hard copy form after they have enrolled. We understand leaders also like having hard copy enrollment forms for your records and we are more than willing to print hard copies after families have enrolled themselves, if you would like. This system will be a great resource for leaders, us, and the families we serve once we are able to utilize all the features.

**4-H families can start enrolling for the 2014-2015 4-H year on November 1, 2014.** This date has been set due to the very quick turn around that is happening therefore the state office is still setting up our database. The 4-H year will still begin on October 1, but 4-H'ers will not be able to enroll until November 1. Enrollment for returning 4-H'ers will be due December 1, which has not changed from the past. We are here to help families as we all make this transition.

**Participation Forms -** Due to the quick turn around Participation forms will still be **required as a hard copy.** We encourage Club Leaders to use participation forms to collect contact information for communication and tracking of club members until official enrollment is available on November 1. The process has not changed where both Club Leaders and the Extension office need to have copies of the participation form. If you have new 4-H families please send us their contact information, so they can receive important emails and the Clover Clips newsletter the first couple of months. For the 2015-2016 4-H year the participation form will be online.
