Very Important Deadlines Coming Up!!

Adding/Dropping Projects - Deadline May 1

The project add/drop deadline for new and returning 4-H'ers is May 1. 4-H'ers who have not established project enrollment by May 1 will not be eligible to exhibit in the corresponding project area at the Johnson County Fair. Project enrollment is an important component of the project experience. This year and going forward, with 4HOnline, 4-H families can update this information any time by simply editing the 4-H'er's profile. This option will be available until midnight on May 1 and then after that the system will not allow any changes to be made to 4-H'ers' projects. If you have questions please contact your club leader or the Extension office.

Completed Participation Form on File - Deadline May 1

A Kansas 4-H Participation form must also be on file at the Extension office and with your club leader by May 1, to be able to participate in the Johnson County Fair. The Spring Beef Show will be held Saturday, April 18, at the Johnson Co. Fairgrounds, beginning at 10 a.m. Pre-registration is due by April 1. The entry fee is \$10 per head, then goes up to \$20 per head after April 1. All market steers and heifers will be weighed from 7-9 a.m. on Saturday morning. 4-H Beef project members not showing in the Spring Beef Show will be allowed to weigh their animals from 6-8 p.m. on Friday, April 17, at the Johnson Co. Fairgrounds.

Spring Goat Show - May 23

The Spring Goat Show will be held Saturday, May 23, at the Johnson County Fairgrounds, beginning at 9 a.m. Pre-registration is due by May 1. The entry fee is \$10 per head, then goes up to \$20 per head after May 1. Weigh-in will be 7-8 a.m. Saturday morning. 4-H Goat project members not showing in the Spring Goat Show will be allowed to weigh their animals from 4-8 p.m. on Friday, May 22 at the Johnson Co. Fairgrounds.

<u>Spring Sheep Show</u> - May 23

Create a garment from a pattern to wear during this year's 4th annual Kansas 4-H Sewing Camp! Participants will explore new sewing concepts and improve current sewing skills. Junior participants (age 9-12) and Senior participants (age 13 and older) will attend camp at K-State Salina, work on touch control sewing machines, and receive assistance from teen counselors and textile knowledgeable adults. Junior camp will be held June 25-27, and Senior camp will be held June 27-30. All fabrics, supplies and equipment will be provided for youth to construct their garment.

Junior participants will choose from an apron, pull-over shirt or pants. Senior participants will choose between a tailored vest or "silky" shirt. National Opportunities

National 4-H Congress 2015 Centennial Delegates

The Kansas 4-H Centennial Delegates were added in 2002 when National 4-H celebrated 4-H's centennial year. Kansas 4-H has permitted each Extension Unit to send one at-large delegate to National 4-H Congress. These at-large positions are called Centennial Delegates. Cost for the Centennial delegate will be the full amount of approximately \$1,150.00. To be eligible, delegates MUST:

- 1) Have never before attended National 4-H Congress
- 2) Be enrolled in Kansas 4-H
- 3) Have a genuine desire to attend National 4-H Congress
- 4) Be available to attend 2015 National 4-H Congress in its entirety from November 27-December 1, 2015
- 5) Be at least 14 years old but not yet 19 years old before January 1, 2015
- 6) Remain committed to attending 2015 National 4-H Congress once they accept the trip
- 7) Agree to follow the prescribed code of conduct, realizing failure to do so may result in the loss of privileges during the event and/or in the future

If you meet these qualifications and this opportunity sounds exciting to you, please let Christin know of your interest by May 1, 2015. One name will be randomly drawn and the winner will need to provide a non-refundable \$100 deposit for the trip by May 11.

Leader Update

Club Reminders

Enrollment - Please help us with the process of getting all Johnson County 4-H members to an Active enrollment status in 4HOnline. You can do this by logging in to your club's account, clicking on "Search" at the top left of the page, and checking the "Status" of your club members and volunteers. If the member has completed and submitted an enrollment with Johnson County 4-H it will say either "Active," "Pending," or "Incomplete." If it says Active then their enrollment is complete for the 2014-2015 4-H year. If it says Pending then their enrollment is waiting for review by us at the county level. They will either be accepted (which changes their status to Active) or their enrollment will be sent back to them requesting additions or edits (this action changes their status to Incomplete). If their status is Incomplete then they need to make the additions/edits that were listed in the email they received from 4HOnline and resubmit their enrollment.

Please contact Christin with any questions. Thank you for your help with our new enrollment process!

Project Leaders and Volunteers must be Registered Volunteers

Remember that project leaders and volunteers must be Registered Volunteers in order to volunteer for your club.

There are three types of volunteers:

<u>Direct Volunteer:</u> A volunteer with authority to independently plan and conduct educational experiences for youth with adults present or in a public setting OR whose position puts them in close, ongoing, interaction with youth. (Examples: community or organizational leader, project leader, activity leader, judging team coach, camp counselor, event chaperone, exchange trip chaperone, countywide project leader, chauffeur for any 4-H activities, etc.) **Direct Volunteers are required to complete the Kansas 4-H Volunteer Screening Process.**

<u>Episodic Volunteer:</u> A volunteer helping with a single "episode" or activity (usually with a Registered 4-H Volunteer present). Volunteers who are considered episodic volunteers serve as workshop presenters, judges, guest speakers, etc. **Episodic Volunteers are not required to complete the Volunteer Screening process.**

<u>Indirect Volunteer:</u> A volunteer supporting 4-H events or activities but not working directly with youth. Volunteers who are considered indirect volunteers serve on committees or boards. Examples may include local 4-H Foundation Board members or PDC members who don't interact with youth. **This person is** <u>not </u>required to complete the Volunteer Screening process.
